Crosstown has introduced me to some of my best friends in Memphis, some of whom live in the building and many more who work here.


### Favorite restaurant, food offering, cocktail, or CBC beer?


### CONCOURSE COMMUNITY FEATURES




## YOUR CONCOURSE



The resurgence of Crosstown as a neighborhood is due, in large part, to the determination of visionary local artists and the contemporary arts non profit Crosstown Arts who took the lead in rethinking spaces, both inside and outside of Crosstown Concourse. With avant-garde programming, performance spaces of all kinds, whimsical displays of public art, free galleries, and cutting-edge resources for multi-disciplinary arts practices, Crosstown Concourse is transformative in the way it cultivates and supports the creative community.

Over 70,000 sq ft of indoor space throughout the building are dedicated to the arts, while public art and local art-focused non-profits, shops, and venues (Urban Art Commission, Ixora, Black Lodge, The Hi-Tone) enliven the neighborhood. 
